## “The Corner of the Past”

The Corner of the Past is a place to “go back to Grandpa & Grandma’s farm”. See the old farm house where apple pie was once baking in the cook stove, quilts are hung on the wall, and if you listen quietly, you can almost hear the old pump organ playing those favorite hymns.

Tour guides will be happy to show you to the summer kitchen, the granary, the quaint log cabins, the tool collection in the machine shed, and the farm implements in the post & beam 100+ year-old barn.



An audio system is also available to those who want to take their time to see all the renovated authentic and historic buildings that were once part of Sister Bay.

Reminisce about what it was like to stay in a 1940s & 1950s cottage by the waters of Green Bay, when you see how the Birch Cottage of Liberty Park has come back to life. Volunteers from the Sister Bay

Historical Society have also restored a blacksmith shop, an old chicken coop, and a quaint migrant worker’s cottage where families came and stayed while picking cherries year after year.

Visitors of all ages will find interesting exhibits and demonstrations. Docents are on hand to teach and entertain children and adults with activities such as making butter, and even ice cream. There is also a Scavenger Hunt for children to do and they can win a free ice cream cone at the Door County Ice Cream Factory.

Various events are part of the summer season at the Corner of the Past. Beginning the end of May, the Farmer’s Market takes place every Saturday morning, when freshly-picked local produce, bakery, flowers, canned sauces, and talented artisans sell their hand-made items. Local artists also appear as part of the weekly Heritage Programs in the large barn. Watch the local newspapers for other events such as the Old Fashioned Ice Cream Social, and the annual Quilt Show.
